Happy 300th Year Anniversary, New Bern!

With 300 years of history, our city has undergone some profound and remarkable changes. It all started in 1710 when Swiss Baron Christopher De Graffenried, Explorer John Lawson, and a group of Swiss and German settlers discovered the beautiful countryside that was named "New Bern" after the Baron's home city of Bern, Switzerland, which is now considered New Bern's "Mother City".

Members of the exploration encountered the Tuscaroran Indians and drove the Indians from their homeland. The Tuscarorans attempted to regain their homestead by taking Baron De Graffenried and John Lawson hostage - John Lawson was killed. The Baron managed to survive and make it back to his new home of New Bern.

After a half century, North Carolina's first permanent Colonial Capitol building was constructed in 1770 and later named Tryon Palace after Governor William Tryon. Tryon Palace became NC's first state Capitol during the Revolutionary War in 1775. The Capital City was relocated in Raleigh in 1795. Tryon Palace burned in 1798. The landmark was rebuilt in 1950 from the original Palace plans. Tryon Palace Historic Sites and Gardens draws in thousands of visitors a year with their re-enactments, lectures, and tours of this grand homestead.

The Civil War Battle of 1862 took place in New Bern as the Union Soldiers considered the city a valuable commodity as a seaport and railroad depot. Visit the Civil War Battlefield at the entrance of Taberna Community off Highway 70 East.

New Bern Pharmacist Caleb Bradham created "Brad's Drink" in 1898, which is now known as Pepsi-Cola. Visit the Pepsi Store on Middle and Pollock Sts to learn more.

James Davis brought the first printing press to New Bern, making it the first in the state of NC to have one. New Bern is also home to NC's first public school.

In 1922 New Bern suffered a horrific fire that engulfed 40 City blocks - mostly the African American neighborhoods with thriving businesses. With resilience, residents re-built New Bern then and continue to rebuild this wonderful city today!

The North Carolina History Education Center is scheduled to open in the summer of 2010 between Tryon Palace and New Bern's Farmer's Market.

New Bern Now is a "Small Town Metropolis" with people from all walks of life with similar visions of having a nice place to live, friendly neighbors and places to gather among friends! From Country Clubs to City Recreation Centers, we strive to enjoy a higher quality of life and take advantage of the Greater New Bern area resources (especially our rivers, National Forest, and the Historic Downtown district).

Notable residents: Beverly Perdue, 1st woman to be elected Governor of NC and Author, Nicolas Sparks.

Students can receive a higher education at Craven County Community College (638-7200) and Mount Olive College at New Bern (633-4464) offering many advanced education opportunities. Craven Smart Start's Child Care Resource and Referral Program (672-5921) offers free child care referral services and other children's services to parents.

New Bern's City Government controls police and emergency services, utilities, taxes, parks and recreation, etc. Craven County Government regulates emergency services, social services, Clerk of Court, Register of Deeds, planning and inspections, New Bern Riverfront Convention Center, Parks and Recreation, and much more.



New Bern Art Shops and Galleries

In celebration of our 300th year Anniversary, New Bern's artists and local businesses have pulled together for two terrific street artwork projects. The "Bear Town Bears" and "Historical Character" fire hydrants are on display throughout the city. Visit New Bern's Chamber of Commerce or the New Bern Visitor's & Convention Center for details and location of this unique street artwork.

Art enthusiasts are taken aback by the masterpieces of New Bern's Artisans. Stroll through the art galleries and shops scattered throughout the city. Start your trip downtown on Craven Street and visit Treasure Crafts and The Accidental Artist, then walk down Pollock Street to see Carolina Creations, make your way up and down Middle Street and visit the Framing Fox Art Gallery, Art of the Wild, Art & Materials, Gallery Arts Printing, Ballantyne Framing and Art, Etched in Time Designs. Walk north on Pollock to see the Craven Arts Council and Gallery located in the Bank of the Arts Building and the ART Gallery.

Don't miss Hancock Street where you can visit Poor Charlie's which is the oldest Antique Flea Market in North Carolina. Across the Street on S. Front Street check out New Bern's Farmer's Market where vendors sell their special arts, crafts, produce, etc. and locals meet on the weekends to shop and gather among friends. Visit Bejeweled Beads and More, Fabulous Findz, and the Pic Frame & Gallery on Trent Road. A short drive to S. Glenburnie Road, stop in on the Frame Shop and Gallery. Drive down the road to Colony Drive and visit Pottery Concepts Gallery and Studio.

Cross over the Bridge into James City to see the Coastal Art and Frame on Hwy 70 E. and Robert's Art Gallery and Shop on Old Cherry Point Road. Please call the Craven Arts Council and Gallery at 252-638-2577 for more information about New Bern's Arts and Cultural Influences.

Outdoor Recreation

Boating, fishing, paddling, hunting, golfing, hiking, bird watching, photography, camping and tennis are only a few of many outdoor recreation opportunities in New Bern.

Nestled between the Neuse and Trent Rivers in Eastern North Carolina, New Bern is a haven for boaters, fishermen, and water sport fanatics. Whether you prefer boating or paddling in a smaller watercraft, you can choose from small tributaries and creeks to the mile wide Neuse River. Fishing is plentiful! Some of the water is brackish so you can catch both salt water and fresh water fish. Catch strippers, crappie, largemouth bass, perch, flounder, and many more species. Stop into our local Field and Stream Sports Store to get the inside scoop! They have two locations: 2723 Neuse Blvd. (637-5100) and 2551 Hwy 70 E (637-6800). Custom Marine Inc, 2401 Hwy 70 E (638-5422) also has boating and fishing equipment. Contact the Neuse Riverkeepers (637-7972) for paddle trail maps and details about boating and fishing in the Neuse or Trent Rivers.

Hunters relish in the enormous Croatan National Forest, spanning approximately 165,000 acres, located in our backyard which also provides a sanctuary for nature lovers. The Croatan is home to the black bear, deer, wild turkey, quail, coyote, beaver, porcupine, rabbit, squirrel, bobcat, American alligator, and bald eagle, pileated woodpecker, red-tailed hawk, to name some of the wildlife species you may see.

A "Nature Lover's Paradise", birdwatchers, hikers, photographers, and walkers enjoy a "walk in the woods" as the forest's habitat supplies excellent conditions for exotic plants like the Venus flytrap, making it the only National Forest with the largest carnivorous plant population. Talk to the trained volunteers or rangers at the National Park Service (NPS) Ranger's Station on Hwy 70 E (638-5628) for more information. There are also walking trails throughout our City and County. Contact New Bern Parks & Recreation (639-2912) and/or Craven County Recreation & Parks (636-6606).

Golfing is another favorite pastime in New Bern. Visit the Emerald Golf Club (633-4440), River Bend Golf & Country Club (638-2819), New Bern Golf and Country Club (637-4061), Taberna Country Club (634-1600), Carolina Pines Golf & Country Club (444-1000), or the Cherry Point Golf Course on Marine Corps Air Base (466-3044). Contact Wild Bill's Golf Shop at 3811 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. (633-9820) for the inside golfing information!

Campers have many choices. You can stay in New Bern's luxury campground - KOA, located on Hwy 17 N in Bridgeton (800-562-3341). They have cabins, RV sites, tents sites, fishing pond, pavilion and a dock on the Neuse River. They also have a small camp store where they sell fire wood and all of the amenities. They even have a dog park for both small and large dogs and an obstacle course. If you prefer a smaller scale campground, visit Flanner's Beach Campground or Neuse River Campground which are run by the NPS. Brice's Creek Boat ramp also has a small primitive campground. For more information about camping in the area, call the NPS (252-638-5628).
